 - It may only be usable in the Summer, we may need to find someone else to deal with the work to winterize it. DPW should investigate the costs of the options.
 - Status Quo The only thing we need to solve, and maybe it has an answer, is where we store the dome in the off-season. No need to build anything onsite.
 - 2. Build a platform and roof as we were thinking. This seems a little redundant and unnecessary if we can't leave the steambath up and useable for the landowners.
